#### What are HAZARDOUS MATERIALS?

 Hazardous Materials are any materials that pose a hazard or threatened hazard to human health & safety or to the environment if released.



# How do I KNOW if my Business has any Hazardous Materials?

- In general, a material can be considered hazardous if it is corrosive, flammable, ignitable, or toxic.
- A rule of thumb to remember is that if the chemical has a warning label or if the manufacturer provides a Safety Data Sheet (SDS), it is generally considered hazardous.
- If you have any questions, contact Solano County Environmental Health—Hazmat.

# What are EXAMPLES of Hazardous Materials?

Some examples of Hazardous Materials:

 $\Rightarrow$  Ammonium Hydroxide  $\Rightarrow$  Antifreeze

 $\Rightarrow$  Carbon Dioxide  $\Rightarrow$  Chlorine (gas)

 $\Rightarrow$  Diesel  $\Rightarrow$  Gasoline

 $\Rightarrow$  Motor Oil  $\Rightarrow$  Nitrogen

 $\Rightarrow$  Oxygen  $\Rightarrow$  Sulfur

 $\Rightarrow$  Waste Engine Oil  $\Rightarrow$  And Many More!

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## What is a HAZARDOUS MATERIALS **BUSINESS PLAN (HMBP)?**

A Hazardous Materials Business Plan (HMBP) is a document containing information about a facility that handles or stores hazardous materials/hazardous waste above specific threshold quantities, and about each specific hazardous material at the facility.

#### What MUST a HMBP Include?

- **HMBP Checklist:** 
  - ⇒ Business Activities regarding hazardous materials
  - ⇒ Business owner/operator information
  - ⇒ Inventory of Hazardous Materials
  - ⇒ Site Map(s) indicating: the location of the business, hazardous materials storage areas, exits, safety equipment, etc.
  - ⇒ Written plan for emergency response including: fires, earthquakes, floods, releases/spills, and other accidents Involving hazardous materials at the facility
  - ⇒ Employee training plan on managing hazardous materials and emergencies



#### Who Must COMPLETE a HMBP?

- The owner of a business that handles or stores hazardous materials/waste at or above the minimum amounts.
- These minimum amounts equal:
  - ⇒ 55 Gallons of Liquid
  - ⇒ 200 Cubic Feet of Gas
  - $\Rightarrow$  500 Pounds of Solid
  - ⇒ Radioactive Materials (where an emergency plan is required by Federal Law)
  - ⇒ Extremely Hazardous Substances (at or above the threshold planning quantities)
- If you are unsure about the amount of Hazardous Materials you have: review your shipping orders, contact supplier, or contact Solano County Environmental Health Division—Hazmat.

### Is my Business REQUIRED to report or is it EXEMPT?

- The thresholds are described above.
- In addition:
  - ⇒ Solano County CUPA has developed a Hazardous Materials Business Plan Reporting Flowchart & **Exemption Summary**

#### What is the PURPOSE of the HMBP?

- The intent of the HMBP is to:
  - ⇒ Inform and assist first responders (e.g. Firefighters, Police, EMTs) so that they can safely respond to emergencies at your business
  - ⇒ Inform the public where hazardous materials are stored in their community
  - ⇒ Inform employees of workplace hazards and the emergency response procedures to use during an emergency

#### Where do I SUBMIT a HMBP?

- Your HMBP must be submitted electronically to the California **Environmental Reporting** System (CERS)

### How often does a HMBP need to be **UPDATED/REVISED?**

- A business, after initial submission:
  - ⇒ Must update and submit their hazardous materials inventory on or before March 1st of every year
  - ⇒ Must review their HMBP once every year
