Area Agency on Aging



The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has scheduled several projects over the coming weekends which will close sections of freeways in our area.

There are three weekend closures on Eastbound I-80 tentatively scheduled on the weekends of **July 21**, **August 4**, **and August 18**. EB I-80 will be closed and traffic detoured beginning at the EB I-80/State Route-4 interchange in Hercules. Closures will start **Fridays at 9pm.** and conclude on the following **Mondays at 5am** 

A 104-hour full highway closure of westbound I-80 is scheduled on Labor Day weekend starting **Thursday**, **August 31 at 9pm** and concluding **at 5am on Tuesday**, **September 5**, **2023**. WB I-80 will be closed and traffic detoured beginning at the WB I-80/I-780 interchange in Vallejo.

Motorists traveling eastbound on I-80 will need to exit onto eastbound SR-4 in Hercules and continue on EB SR-4 to Northbound I-680. Motorists can use NB I-680 to reach I-80 in Fairfield or use WB I-780 to access the Benicia and Vallejo areas. Cummings Skyway between SR-4 and I-80 will also be open for motorists heading to the Crockett area.

Motorists traveling westbound on I-80 at I-780 (Curtola Pkwy) will need to exit onto eastbound I-780 in Vallejo and continue on EB I-780 to SB I-680. Motorists can use SB I-680 to reach WB SR-4,

# Vanden and Canon Roads All-Way Stop Begins August 9

The City of Fairfield has been working with Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR), Capital Corridor Joint Power Authority (CCJPA), California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), Travis Air Force Base, Solano County, and the City of Vacaville to improve vehicular and railroad safety at the intersection of Vanden Road and Canon Road by installing an All-Way Stop.

The plans have been finalized, and construction is anticipated to start on August 1 and conclude on August 9. Starting on August 9, road users must make a complete stop when traveling North or South Bound on Vanden Road.

#### Need a ride to the doctor?

You can now get a ride to and from your doctor visits at no charge As a Kaiser Permanente Medicare health plan member, you can get a ride to and from your appointments at no cost. Your plan covers up to 24 one-way trips (50 miles per trip) per calendar year.

To schedule a ride for rideshare, taxi, or private transportation service, call 1-877-930-1477 (TTY 711). You can also schedule online at medicaltrip.net or download the MTM Link Member app. To download the app on your device, visit the App Store (Apple) or Google Play (Android) and search for MTM Link Member App.

For wheelchair van or gurney van transportation service, call 1-833-226-6760.

Request your ride at least 3 business days (Monday through Friday) before your appointment. If you have an urgent last-minute appointment, call as soon as you can.

You can get rides for doctor appointments, medical services such as lab or X-ray, and picking up medications or medical equipment.

# Bay Area Housing Finance Authority eyes \$10-20 billion general obligation bond in November 2024

The Bay Area Housing Finance Authority (BAHFA) and Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) are eyeing a potential \$10 billion to \$20 billion regional general obligation bond for housing on the 2024 ballot. If successful, the money would be used build and preserve between 40,000 to 80,000 affordable homes across the nine-county region. The law authorizing the bond measure requires that 80 percent of the funds be returned directly to each county and a handful of cities in proportion to their contributions towards the bond.

ABAG staff is developing an expenditure plan, subject to approval by the ABAG Executive Board and BAHFA, for the regionally administered 20 percent of funds. An overview of the statutory framework for the regional housing bond and initial plans for a 2024 measure are available here.



#### CDBG 101 Workshop Aug 10



The City of Fairfield Housing Services Department will be hosting a CDBG 101 program workshop for non-profit organizations on Thursday, August 10, from 2 to 4pm at 1000 Kentucky St., Lakeside Room A. The workshop will provide information about the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and upcoming application process.

The CDBG Program exists to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing and suitable

living environments through expanding economic opportunities, principally for low-to-moderate income persons.

At the workshop, staff will provide an overview of the CDBG Program, guidelines, expectations, and reporting requirements. Attendees will receive detailed information on the current state of the CDBG Program and technical assistance to prepare them to apply for CDBG funding with the City of Fairfield. # Applications being accepted for Advisory Council

The Napa/Solano Area Agency on Aging (AAA) is accepting applications for its Advisory Council. AAA is a comprehensive and coordinated service system focused on improving the lives of older adults, persons with disabilities, their families, and caregivers.

Its current four-year Area Plan established four priority areas: improving health outcomes; reducing social isolation; raising nutritional awareness and services; and enhancing community-based, long-term services and supports.

Supporting the work of the Napa/Solano AAA is an Advisory Council, comprised of sixteen members, eight from each county. Council members are appointed by the respective Board of Supervisors and are charged with (1) advising the AAA on funding and service priorities, (2) assisting with provider performance reviews, and (3) advocacy. As advocates for older adults, Council members are expected to be informed about key legislation and issues facing the older adult population locally, voice their concerns with elected officials, and inform and gather support from other community members.

The Advisory Council meets on the first Tuesday of the month from 10 am to 12 noon. Meetings alternate monthly between Napa and Fairfield. The monthly time commitment averages 3-5 hours.

#### iPad distribution

Any older adults at risk of social isolation and don't already have an internet connected device and cannot afford to purchase a tablet to connect with family, friends, or telehealth appointments, may be eligible for a free device.

Devices are limited to older adults (60+) or adults with permanent disabilities who are at risk and do not have access to a device. Those interested should contact the Aging and Disability Resource Connection at (707) 200-7116. Callers need to leave a message so an intake coordinator can return the call and administer a brief intake guestionnaire to determine if the person is eligible to receive

a device. Devices are reserved for the most at-risk individuals as numbers are limited.

#### Solano Water Institute for teachers

# Solano Mobility Express Vanpool Pilot Program

The Solano Transportation Authority (STA), in partnership with Commute with Enterprise, presents the Solano Mobility Express Vanpool Pilot Program, traveling weekdays between the Vacaville Transportation Center and Sacramento, and between the Dixon Park & Ride and Sacramento.

There is a limited time introductory offer of \$50 for a monthly pass (regularly \$90) for riders traveling between Sacramento and Vacaville or Dixon. Solano Express Blue Line riders starting their commute in Vacaville or Dixon who purchased a monthly pass in the last six months and commute to Sacramento are eligible for the introductory price of \$50.Solano Express Blue Line riders who purchase a monthly pass and start their commute south of Vacaville can transfer in Vacaville to the Solano Mobility Express Vanpool for free.
