# **Dedication to Gordon Lightfoot**

This newsletter I want to acknowledge the death of Gordon Lightfoot. He was 84. I enjoyed his music. Music sing to while in the car, music that was romantic (think "If you could read my mind" and "Sundown") and historically (think "The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald") I had the chance over the years to see him in concert 3 times. His music will live on anytime one has their heart broken.

The native Canadian won 16 Juno awards (Canada's Music Awards) and scored eight top 5 albums in Canada during the 1970s. Lightfoot was held in high regard by other artists with Bob Dylan once remarking that "I can't think of any Gordon Lightfoot song I don't like," adding, "Every time I hear a song of his, it's like I wish it would last forever."

### Fairfield City Council listening tour


Fairfield Mayor Cat Moy along with the city council will continue to visit each district as part of a "Heart to Heart Listening Tour."



# Link21 awarded \$11.3 million in federal funding

On April 24, the Capitol Corridor Joint Powers Authority (Capitol Corridor) was awarded \$11.3 million in project development funds for Link21 to be used for program design and environmental advancement.

Link21 is a long-range transportation program sponsored by the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District (BART) and the Capitol Corridor Joint Powers Authority (Capitol Corridor) to transform the train network serving the 21-county Northern California Megaregion. Link21 is planning for the construction of a second underground train crossing of the San Francisco Bay. This crossing will enable riders access to destinations across Northern California.

As of January 1, 2023, California law requires all boat operators 50 years of age or younger to take a certified safe boating class and carry the California Boater Card to operate a motorboat

### Kids day at Pena Adobe



### **World Environment Day**

Solano and Yolo county residents are invited to celebrate World Environment Day at Lake Solano on **Saturday, June 3rd at 9am** to learn about the Lake Berryessa and Putah Creek watersheds. The event will allow residents to remove trash debris, plant wildflower plugs, create take-home seed packets, and participate in other group and family-friendly activities including kayak tours of Lake Solano.

A free lunch will be served to all participants, who should wear sturdy shoes, work gloves, and sun protection.

Lake Solano County Park, approximately 4 miles west of Winters, CA, on Pleasants Valley Road just south of Highway 128. Volunteers that choose to assist with trash cleanup activities will cleanup at Lake Berryessa and Lake Solano. Parking fees will be waived with a pass provided to event registrants in advance.

This water is also the primary source of irrigation water for growers in the region. Also filling and leaving Lake Solano is Putah Creek, a vital ecological link between the neighboring mountain range and the Yolo Bypass.

#### **Events I attended this week**

**Friday, April 28**, I was invited to attend a virtual event focusing on the Master Plan for Aging's Caregiving that Works Bold Goals. I served on a panel with other Supervisors and local leaders. We discussed that caregivers needed more respite time. Maintaining a well-trained, workforce to provide care for our community members is needed. Counties need to look at community colleges to deliver the training needed to have this workforce. The topics discussed were diverse. I enjoyed the interaction with everyone. This is a top priority of mine as I serve as the chair of Napa/Solano Area Agency on Aging this year.

**Monday, May 1**, I spent time on Zoom with my constituents on Mare Island. The topic was about Community Facilities District (CFDs). The 322 homes are paying on 3 CFDs. The main issue is why do they pay twice for fire and police protection. Shouldn't their "normal" property tax pay for that service. It was a very informative session. My office has sent letters before on this issue, but having the information re-freshen is a good reminder of the issues.

**Wednesday, May 3**, I attended the Nurse-Family Partnership Graduation. This program helps first time parents from pregnancy up to age 2. Ten little ones "graduated" from the course. Having healthy families is one of many services the county provides.
