Traffic Advisory

For the next two consecutive weekends there will be lane closures on westbound Interstate-80 (I-80) between Pomona Street in Crockett and Willow Avenue in Hercules, CalTrans has announced.

U.S. Federal Govt. Shutdown

The U.S. Federal Government is set to shut down this Sunday, October 1 starting at 12:01am EST unless Congress manages to pass a bill to extend funding into the new federal fiscal year.

During a shutdown, the federal government can <u>only</u> spend money on essential services, including those related to law enforcement and public safety. While the likelihood of a government shutdown is still unknown, it has left many of us wondering how a government shutdown might impact us locally.

The following are some services that are not generally impacted by a federal government shutdown, including:

- Social Security payments
- Medicaid and Medicare services will continue
- Transportation Security Administration will continue, however, travelers may experience delays
- Postal mail will continue to be delivered
- Unemployment benefits will continue to be delivered
- Amtrak services will continue to operate as usual
- Public schools would continue to operate as usual as teachers/staff are not federal employees

How County programs and services could be impacted is hard to predict as there are several factors to consider, including, and not limited to (1) the duration of a government shutdown, (2) how much the State has in reserves and (3) how much (or little) the federal government supports individual programs. The following is a list of County programming that <u>could</u> be impacted, including:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Child Care and Development Funds (CCDF)
- Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) cleanup assistance and inspections
- Justice and Public Safety programming that relies on federal grant funding assistance
- Relief funding could be significantly slowed down for recovery efforts following a local disaster

Solano Public Health recommends updated COVID-19 and flu vaccines

The Solano County Department of Health and Social Services, Public Health division is recommending the updated monovalent COVID-19 vaccine for everyone six (6) months and older to protect them against severe COVID-19 illness this fall and winter. Additionally, Solano Public Health recommends



residents get their annual flu vaccine, county officials announced.

Individuals five (5) years of age and older, regardless of previous vaccination, are recommended to receive a single dose of the updated mRNA COVID-19 vaccine. Individuals six (6) months through four (4) years of age who have been previously vaccinated are recommended to receive one (1) or two (2) doses of the updated mRNA COVID-19 vaccine, depending on history and timing of previous COVID-19 vaccine doses. Unvaccinated individuals six (6) months through four (4) years of age are recommended to receive three (3) doses of the updated Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine or two (2) doses of the updated Moderna Covid-19 Vaccine. An updated COVID-19 vaccine dose can be given at least two (2) months after receipt of a prior COVID-19 vaccine dose.

In addition to getting the updated COVID-19 vaccine, residents six months and older should also get their annual vaccination for influenza. Timely flu shots help prevent a disease that hospitalizes hundreds of thousands and kills tens of thousands of Americans every year. The start of the flu season is unpredictable, and the vaccine takes two weeks to become fully effective once administered.

Individuals who are interested in getting the updated monovalent COVID-19 vaccine should reach out to their healthcare provider. Consumer Alert

Earlier this year Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara acted to expand commercial coverage through the FAIR Plan, California's insurer of last resort. Commercial coverage is available through the FAIR Plan to homeowners associations, condo associations, farms, and businesses of all kinds when they are unable to find insurance through the normal market.

Now the Department of Insurance has approved the FAIR Plan to increase commercial coverage limits to \$20M per location for its Commercial Property Program and Business Owner's Program (BOP). The effective date for the higher commercial property limits will be no later than November 1, 2023 and the effective date for the higher BOP limits will be no later than December 14, 2023.

Commissioner Lara also announced that he has reached an agreement with insurance companies to increase writing in wildfire distressed areas. As part of that he will direct the FAIR Plan to increase its commercial limits again to \$20 million per building, responding to consumers who need temporary coverage. The FAIR Plan has confirmed that maximum limits may be increased for policies that renew before the implementation dates above once the new limits have been implemented. When these policyholders request a new policy with higher limits, the FAIR Plan has agreed that:

There will be no additional administrative cost or fee to process;
Photo and inspection requirements will be waived; and,
FAIR Plan will not cancel the existing policy until it is certain the new policy with higher limits can be issued to avoid any coverage gap.

SANDAG kills mileage tax

Vallejo Ferry Terminal Reconfiguration Project

The rate of siltation in the Napa River has drastically increased in the last decade resulting in an increased dredging frequency from once every 4 years to once every 1.5 to 2 years. Each dredging episode costs WETA nearly \$2 million, an expense expected to increase over time.


The Vallejo Ferry Terminal Reconfiguration Project will relocate the float away from the basin area where the heaviest accumulation of sediment occurs, thereby, reducing the need to dredge frequently and saving WETA up to approximately \$21 million over the next 20 years.

Just as important as the cost savings this project would have on strained budgets, dredging and low tide episodes are also disruptive to passengers and service operations. Due to the amount of siltation filling in the ferry terminal basin leading up to scheduled dredging projects, WETA has had to cancel service during low tide events, leaving passengers with no direct transit option to San Francisco. Additionally, each dredging episode takes approximately two to four weeks to complete, during which time WETA must establish a temporary terminal using a temporary float and alternative gangway and redirect passengers.

The goal of the Vallejo Terminal Reconfiguration Project is to reduce the frequency of dredge events and provide more suitable berthing configurations for the ferry vessels that will maximize service efficiency while minimizing disruption to passengers.

Construction Apprenticeship Programs



Do you know anyone interested in a career that offers a living wage, on-the-job paid training, paid health benefits, and a secure pension plan? Then applying to one of the many Construction Apprenticeship Programs in the area might be a good fit.

The minimum qualifications for most apprenticeship programs include being at least 18 years old, a high school diploma, reliable transportation, and passing a basic math test.

For some people, the inability to pass the math test is a stumbling block in gaining access to these apprenticeship programs. The Vallejo Adult School, in partnership with CTWI, The Construction Trades Workforce Initiative, offers a unique math class designed specifically to help those interested in passing an Apprenticeship Entrance exam. In a low stress environment, the class helps students master fractions, decimals, percentages, basic algebra, and basic geometry problems that they will encounter on the Apprenticeship Entrance exams. Fire Prevention Week from October 8 to 14

"Cooking safety starts with YOU! Pay attention to fire prevention is the theme for Fire Prevention Week, this October 8 to 14, 2023. This year's focus on cooking safety works to educate the public about simple but important steps they can take to help reduce the risk of fire when cooking at home, keeping themselves and those around them safe.

First of all, how many smoke alarms do you have in your home?

The National Fire Protection Association has some great tips:

- Install alarms on **every** level of the home, especially the kitchen, and yes, the basement, too!

-Install smoke alarms in **every** sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area.

-Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound!

-A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall and at least 10 feet from the stove.

-People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms that have strobe lights and bed shakers.

City of Vallejo Housing Element



The public review draft of the City of Vallejo Housing Element is being released up to October 24 in order for the public to review and provide comments, before it is sent to the California State Department of Housing and Community Development Department for its initial review.

The Planning Commission, the Housing and

Community Development Commission and the City Council will also each hold public meetings to consider this document. The purpose of each public meeting will be to provide an overview of the public review draft of the Housing Element, provide an outline for the review process itself, and to ensure that the public will have an opportunity to provide verbal comments on document. No action will be taken at any of these meetings.

Each of these meetings are held at City Hall, 555 Santa Clara Street, Vallejo, California. Members of the Public will be able to participate in-person or remotely via Zoom.

A Housing Element is a state required element of a City's General Plan. The Housing Element must be updated every eight years and includes goals, objectives, policies, and implementation programs that address the maintenance, preservation, improvement, and development of housing in city limits. In addition, the Housing Element Update identifies sites appropriate for the development of multifamily housing. The Housing Element Update also includes other amendments necessary to comply with recent changes in State law. Prior to the submittal of the Draft to the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) for their review and comment, a Draft Housing Element has been prepared and now available for a 47 day public review and comment period. It is longer than the 30 day mandated public review period so that the community members will have the ability to share their comments at the City Council meeting on October 24.

Solano Mobility


Did you know? Solano Mobility offers a multitude of programs for commuters and travelers who live or work in Solano County. Some programs include:

- **Guaranteed Ride** If you ride the Solano Express Blue, Green, Red or Yellow Line to travel to work in Solano County, or to travel from Solano County to your workplace, you can receive an Uber Voucher to use if your Solano Express route is cancelled.
- Amtrak + Lyft If you are a resident or employed in Fairfield, Suisun City, or Vacaville, the Amtrak + Lyft Program provides participants a 10-ride Amtrak pass plus

10 free Solano County train station Lyft connections, all for \$20.

- **Guaranteed Ride Home** If you use a commute alternative like transit, carpool, or vanpool to travel to work in Solano County or travel from Solano County to your workplace, you can get reimbursement for your emergency ride home.

Updates from around Solano County Lopes Road Fencing Project



In mid-March 2023, the hillside west of Lopes Road became saturated from the winter rainstorms, causing a failure in Lopes Road that broke the city of Benicia's water supply line and other underground utilities. Since then, the city of Fairfield has worked with Benicia to temporarily reestablish Benicia's water supply, as well as determine the full extent of damage to the City of Fairfield's underground utilities. Both cities are working with the Federal Emergency Management Agency

(FEMA) and California Office of Emergency Services (Cal-OES) to receive financial support through public assistance grants.

In the meantime, the City of Fairfield must preserve the security of the affected area, and residents will see fenced gates installed across Lopes Road at the north (approximately a quarter mile south of Gold Hill Road) and south (approximately half-mile north of Marshview Road) ends of the affected portions of Lopes Road area. There is no permittance of pedestrian or cycling traffic, and the site will continue to be monitored.

-If drilling is successful, production equipment including a natural gas pipeline will be installed




