MEDICAL EMERGENCIES M-3 - Severe Nausea and Vomiting

For patient complaint of severe nausea and vomiting initiate the following:

- Treat any cause of the nausea and/or vomiting, (e.g. myocardial infarction, diabetes) per the appropriate treatment protocol.
- Consider IV of Normal Saline (NS);

For hypotension consider a fluid bolus of 500 ml of NS, consider a second bolus if hypotension persists.

For patients 4 years and older consider;
 Ondansetron 4 mg PO or Oral Dissolving
 Tablet (ODT), IM, or IV administered over 1
 minute. (May repeat dose once after 10
 minutes.)

Treatment Considerations:

- Maintain ABCs;
- Consider administration of oxygen;
- Evaluate patient for signs of dehydration, document findings;

Contraindications:

--Known sensitivity to Ondansetron or other 5-HT3 antagonists.

Side Effects:

- -- May cause hypotension and/or tachycardia;
- -- May cause syncope with rapid administration.

Treatment Considerations:

- -- May be used in breast feeding mothers:
- -- May be co-administered with Morphine Sulfate when administered for pain;
- --Moisture may cause the ODT medication to dissolve, care should be taken when administering the medication.

Disrupted Communications

In the event of a "disrupted communications" situation, the paramedic in Solano County may utilize all portions of this treatment protocol needed to stabilize an immediate patient without Base Hospital Contact.
