## INFORMATION RELEASE 03/11/15 S.E.T. TEAM ARRESTS WANTED FELON WITH METHAMPHETAMINE AND GUN

On Tuesday March 10, 2015, approximately 2 p.m., the Solano County Sheriff's Enforcement Team (S.E.T.), with assistance from the Solano County Sheriff's Office California Multi-Jurisdictional Methamphetamine Enforcement Team, arrested a wanted felon found to be in possession of a semi-automatic handgun and methamphetamine.

The incident began earlier in the day when S.E.T members developed information that a wanted suspect out of Contra Costa County was staying at the Comfort Inn on Central Place in Fairfield. S.E.T. members went to the area and began searching for 32 year old LOUIS MARSH, who was on felony probation out of Contra Costa County, and had two outstanding felony warrants. Marsh was listed as a transient out of Richmond.

While at the Comfort Inn, S.E.T. members observed Marsh enter a room and close the door. A perimeter was established and a phone call was placed to the room in an effort to have Marsh exit. After answering the phone and hanging up, Marsh attempted to flee and was taken into custody just outside his room.

After Marsh was taken into custody, a search of his room was conducted. Inside Marsh's room, S.E.T. team members and detectives from CAL-MMET located a .45 caliber semi-automatic handgun with one illegal high capacity magazine, 16 rounds of live .45 caliber ammunition, approximately 80 grams of methamphetamine and a digital scale.

Marsh was booked into the Solano County Jail on the two felony warrants out of Contra Costa County and the following new felony charges in Solano County: felon in possession of a firearm, felon in possession of live ammunition, possession of a high-capacity magazine, possession of methamphetamine for sale and possession of a controlled substance while armed with a loaded firearm. Marsh is being held at the Solano County Jail with a no-bail status due to his Contra Costa County warrants. Marsh's first court appearance is scheduled for Thursday, March 12th at 1:30 p.m. in the Fairfield Courthouse.
