The Solano County Board of Supervisors met on the 23rd day of August, 2005 in regular session in the Chambers of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Solano in the Solano County Administrative Center, 675 Texas Street, Fairfield, California at 8:33 A.M. pursuant to County Code Section 2-1.103. Present were Supervisors Kromm, Reagan, Silva, and Vice-Chair Vasquez. Chairwoman Kondylis arrived at 8:34 A.M. Also present were Michael D. Agenda Item No. 10 Public Comment on Consent Calendar

The Chairwoman invited individuals of the public to make public comment on Consent Calendar Items. The following comments were received:

A) Item No. 18A – Acceptance of a First 5 Solano grant to provide prenatal services to women at risk of, or identified as abusing alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. In response to a question posed by Supervisor Reagan, Dr. Ron Chapman noted that savings would be incurred with healthier birth outcomes and the need for less medical intervention and developmental delays. Dr. Chapman noted

that they would be changing the way in which healthcare is delivered to pregnant women in Solano County by providing screenings through their health care providers. Supervisor Reagan recommended that the Department of Health and Social Services set up a program to identify where the savings occur to other health and social services programs by the implementation of this new program in order to provide funding to continue the new program after the grant funds have expired.

- B) Item No. 22B Traffic Order 389 establishing yield signs at the intersection of Abernathy Road and Rockville Road at the location of the new roundabout. Supervisor Kromm noted that the curbs were being modified and that the flow of the traffic had improved with the installation of the yield signs.
- C) Item No. 23 Resolution declaring September as Solano County Literacy Month. In response to a question posed by Supervisor Kromm, County Librarian Ann Cousineau noted that the Literacy Program and the Library Foundation worked together to purchase books to programs that encourage reading and reading to children through the Pediatric Literacy Program "Reach Out and Read". Supervisor Reagan noted that there has been an increase in functional literacy and commended staff for their efforts.

Agenda Item No. 33 Potrero Hills Landfill

The Board of Supervisors held a continued public hearing to review the Planning Commission's action of June 23, 2005 concerning proposed revisions to Use Permit U-88-33 and Marsh Development Permit MD-88-09 (Potrero Hills Landfill).

Dwight Acey, speaking on behalf of the Citizens Against the Dump Expansion, expressed their concern regarding the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) as they did not feel that it adequately addressed traffic, waste tonnage, tonnage limits, siting element criteria, lateral expansion, and alternatives required by CEQA. Mr. Acey noted that they were concerned that the Potrero Hills Landfill (PHLF) had further interest in expansion as they owned a number of other parcels of property in the same vicinity. Mr. Acey noted that it was their opinion that the resources of Solano County were being squandered by allowing other counties to dispose of their waste in Solano County and impact to the Suisun Marsh. Mr. Acey requested that the Board uphold the Suisun Marsh Protection Plan.

Ron Glas, Principal Planner for the Solano County Department of Resource Management, provided additional information in response to various questions posed by the Board members at the meeting of August 9, 2005. Mr. Glas noted that a comment letter was received from the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board (SFRWQCB) Watershed Division noting their concerns regarding the adequacy of the EIR in addressing impacts to wetlands, associated endangered species and vernal pool habitat. Said letter also discussed priority of avoidance measures and minimization measures over mitigation measures. Mr. Glas noted that the SFRWQCB looked for avoidance of impacts, if impacts unavoidable they look for minimization of impacts, and then mitigation measures.

The Board received comments from Keith Roberson, SFRWQCB and Barry Yeung, Bay Area Air Quality Management District.

Chairwoman Kondylis opened the hearing to the public.

Concerns expressed included a project that was not well-defined, health problems from diesel fumes, increase in traffic, waste near the Suisun Marsh, and daily cover and permit violations. Support was given for an enclosed recycling facility and the imposition of a landfill tax to increase recycling programs, reduce waste, and subsidize rates for Solano County residents.

The Board of Supervisors recessed this meeting at 7:30 p.m. and reconvened at 7:43 p.m. All members were present. Chairwoman Kondylis presided.

Larry Burch, representing Republic Services at Potrero Hills Landfill, clarified concerns expressed regarding the scope of the project and noted that liners at the landfill were above the State standards, fires at the landfill were non-existent and fires at the recycling center from hot loads were attended to immediately, landfill gas would not be trucked away from the landfill, falcons scare gulls without attacking, standards for air emissions were adhered to, no surface water flows to the Suisun Marsh, project designed to handle flooding potential issues, traffic not changing from past to the future and counted in the EIR, reserve capacity for residents of Solano County could be resolved, and property values have not declined. Mr. Burch encouraged the Board to certify the EIR and approve the proposed expansion.

Mr. Burch responded to concerns expressed by the Board members which included traffic, litter control, calculation error in the draft EIR by EDAW, and future expansion beyond Phase 2.

The Board of Supervisors recessed this meeting at 9:10 p.m. and reconvened at 9:20 p.m. All members were present. Chairwoman Kondylis presided.

As there was no one else who wished to speak on this matter, Chairwoman Kondylis closed the hearing to the public.

Chairwoman Kondylis noted that the Suisun Marsh Local Protection Plan did not anticipate this type of activity and that the adequacy of the EIR was flawed if the project were to go forward. Chairwoman Kondylis noted that the Local Protection Plan stated that the facility would operate until it reached capacity and that expansion would impact upland grassland areas which was valuable habitat for marsh related wildlife. Chairwoman Kondylis did not feel that impacts to the Suisun Marsh by the landfill expansion should be mitigated to less than significant. Chairwoman Kondylis noted that the Suisun Marsh Local Protection Plan states no new wells in this area unless for agriculture, no new roads in the Marsh, and no alteration to streambeds unless for flood protection.

Supervisor Kromm expressed his opposition to the proposed expansion of the landfill as he felt that the project was not sensitive to air quality and was not consistent with the Local Protection Plan.

At the conclusion of discussion by the Board, the Board adopted a Motion of Intent to certify the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR), to uphold the appeal of Potrero Hills Landfill, Inc. of the Planning Commission's denial of the revisions requested by Potrero Hills Landfill, Inc. to Use Permit U-88-33 and Marsh Development Permit MD-88-09. Directed staff to prepare resolutions incorporating the additional conditions of approval proposed by the Board members to include high wind fencing, a compliance officer, an advisory committee, baseline for air quality, Potrero Hills Landfill volunteering to give priority consideration to ensure capacity for future needs of Solano County residents, an additional \$.15 per ton for an education project fee, and request to the Bay Area Air Quality Management District for assistance to ensure that air credits come out of Solano County and return to the Board at a later date.
