Subject: Significant Issues Update

1) Habitat for Humanity Partner Family Search

The Board of Supervisors allocated \$200,000 of the Community Investment Fund and \$215,000 American Rescue Plan Act local funds toward building three 3-bedroom homes on Woolner Avenue in Fairfield. The homes will be sold to low-income Solano County families at a reasonable price to put them on a path toward hiring and economic stability.

Habitat for Humanity is beginning their Partner Family Search to identify three eligible families to purchase the homes. Families must meet income-eligibility and other requirements. To learn more about eligibility requirements and how to apply for one of these Habitat homes, residents are invited to attend a Family Search Orientation meeting on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, from 6:30pm to 7:30pm or on Saturday, May 7, 2022, from 10:30am to 11:30am at the Joseph Nelson Community Center at 611 Village Drive in Suisun City. Doors will be open for check-in one hour before the presentation begins.

2) <u>Update on April 5, 2022 Assembly District 11 Special Vacancy Election – Certified Results from the Solano County Registrar of Voters</u>

The Solano County Registrar of Voters (ROV) has prepared a certified statement of the results of the April 5, 2022 Assembly District 11 Special Vacancy Election.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION

- 149,420 number of ballots Issued to all voters in the affected area
- 17,988 number of ballots submitted by mail
- 687 number of ballots submitted in-person at election day polling places
- 12.50% percent overall registered voter turnout
- 93.98% percent Percentage of Solano County voters who voted in the election to elect Lori D Wilson

ENSURING ACCURACY OF RESULTS

As part of canvassing the results, the ROV performed an audit which included a random hand count of 3% percent of the valid ballots, comparing the totals to the electronic results submitted to ensure accuracy. No discrepancies were discovered during the hand count audit of the results.

To ensure a smooth election process, the ROV coordinated with a variety of community groups whose membership helped to observe, volunteer and disseminate information to voters and the public. LOCAL CITIZEN GROUP

The ROV would like to thank the various citizen groups and poll workers for their assistance during the Special Vacancy Election for managing 35 poll places around the county.

ESTIMATED COST OF THE SPECIAL VACANCY ELECTION

The cost of the special election is still being calculated, not to exceed planned budget of \$1,458,050, of which \$692,050 will be used with the remainder of State Funds from the 2021 recall election.


