




- Public access shoreline fishing



Reasons Why People Go (36 responses)





PROCESS FOR IDENTIFYING PROJECT CONCEPTS

- MOU outcome is to present recommendations and conceptual actions to advance
- Current focus is to engage with local interests and hear suggestions
- MOU Partners will review all suggestions and select a feasible option(s)
- "Selection" requires evaluation relative to planning considerations
- Qualitative Ranking (High-Medium-Low)


