Renaming of Airport Administration Building

On June 13, 2023, just three days before the 50th anniversary of the County acquiring the airport, the Board of Supervisors approved the renaming of the Airport Administration Building to the "Edwin I. Power, Jr., Administration Building". Supervisor John Vasquez, District 4, led this initiative to recognize and honor Edwin Power's role in establishing the Nut Tree Airport.

For those who aren't aware, the Nut Tree Airport grew out of the efforts of the Power family who started with a simple roadside fruit stand in Vacaville in the 1920s that grew into the famous "Nut Tree" destination. The growth was greatly spurred by people flying to the airport to eat at the well-known Nut Tree restaurant and shop at its specialty

It was the oldest son, Edwin Power, who had the passion for aviation and a vision for the airport, and this naming of the Airport's Admin building is a fitting tribute.

Next step is designing the signage for the exterior of the building. We plan to have a ceremony to dedicate the newly named building once the signs are in place.

On May 23rd, the Board of Supervisors approved the Airport Elevator Code Upgrade Project. This will bring the Airport elevator up to current building code. The contractor is Dream Ride Elevator and the work will happen over the next three months. Airport Administration will post and notify airport tenants and stakeholders as soon as those days are known.

Enterprise Rent-a-Car Joins Airport

The airport will soon have a rental car agency back on the airfield – Enterprise Rent-a-car. They will have offices in the same building as Wing's Flight School and Aviation Specialties.

Hertz Rental Car agency vacated the premises over a year ago and staff have been working diligently with Enterprise to work out the agreement details. As part of their business, Enterprise will also be building a "wash pad" to wash their cars. The wash pad will be located between the Museum and their offices.

The Board approved the lease agreement on June 13 and Enterprise staff will start their office improvements on July 1st. While the wash pad is being constructed, Enterprise will be temporarily using the Aircraft wash rack to wash their cars. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience this may cause aircraft owners. Enterprise expects to have the wash pad completed in early September.
