Fairfield wants to annex county parcels

This is a letter to inform my constituents about the information sent out on Wednesday from the Solano Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). The city of Fairfield is looking to annex three county parcels: A portion of Pittman Road (the land next to the new storage unit), the proposed apartments on the open land on Sunset between E. Travis Blvd and E-Tabor. Behind the land is Grange Middle School, and the church on E-Travis Blvd, turn right, the land is on the left right before the RR crossing.

I had a meeting with the LAFCO executive director and told him I was not very happy about how this item was handled. Having this phase one issue labeled Pittman Road with a church and apartments made no sense to me. Having this item come without any prior knowledge especially after the meeting several weeks ago at the Fairfield City Council where is sounded to me that the city wants to annex Suisun Valley

(Mankas corner area) and then the part of agriculture land that is my district makes me very leery, let alone finding out that 400 homes are still being discussed to be built inside the quarry on Nelson Hill. (I first heard of this seven years ago and thought the idea had died.)

Here are the rules: Government Code 56375.3: states that an island annexation initiated by a city must be approved by LAFCO and protest proceeding are waived if the following requirements are met: (Island meeting the property is alone)

- Annexation is proposed by resolution of the annexing city.
- The island is 150 acres or less in size.
- The island is surrounded or substantially surrounded by the annexing city or by the annexing city and adjacent cities.
- The island is not a gated community where services are currently provided by a community services district.
- The island is substantial developed or developing based on the availability of public utilities, presence of public improvements or the presence of physical improvements on the parcels within the area.
- The island is not prime ag land as defined in Government Code Section 56064
- The island is receiving benefits from the annexing city or will benefit from the city.
- The island was not created Jan. 1, 2000.

Furthermore, California Legislature enacted special legislation in 2001 (Government Code Section 56375.3) to make it easier for cities to annex certain unincorporated islands. The law allows cities to annex islands through a streamlined process that does not require protest proceedings or elections, provided the island meets the above eight requirements and is 150 acres or less in size.

Major pavement repair work



The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has scheduled several projects over the coming weekends which will close sections of freeways in our area.

There are weekend closures on Eastbound I-80 scheduled for the weekend of **August 18**. EB I-80 will be closed and traffic detoured beginning at the EB I-80/State Route-4 interchange in Hercules. The closure will start **Friday at 9pm** and conclude on the following **Monday at 5am**.

A 104-hour full highway closure of westbound I-80 is scheduled on Labor Day weekend starting **Thursday**, **August 31 at 9pm** and concluding **at 5am on Tuesday**, **September 5**, **2023**. WB I-80 will be closed and traffic detoured beginning at the WB I-80/I-780 interchange in Vallejo.

Motorists traveling eastbound on I-80 will need to exit onto eastbound SR-4 in Hercules and continue on EB SR-4 to Northbound I-680. Motorists can use NB I-680 to reach I-80 in Fairfield or use WB I-780 to access the Benicia and Vallejo areas. Cummings Skyway between SR-4 and I-80 will also be open for motorists heading to the Crockett area.

Motorists traveling westbound on I-80 at I-780 (Curtola Pkwy) will need to exit onto eastbound I-780 in Vallejo and continue on EB I-780 to SB I-680. Motorists can use SB I-680 to reach WB SR-4, WB SR-24 or WB I-580 to access central and south Bay Area destinations.

Need a ride to the doctor?

You can now get a ride to and from your doctor visits at no charge As a Kaiser Permanente Medicare health plan member, you can get a ride to and from your appointments at no cost. Your plan covers up to 24 one-way trips (50 miles per trip) per calendar year.

To schedule a ride for rideshare, taxi, or private transportation service, call 1-877-930-1477 (TTY 711). You can also schedule online at medicaltrip.net or download the MTM Link Member app. To download the app on your device, visit the App Store (Apple) or Google Play (Android) and search for MTM Link Member App.

Request your ride at least 3 business days (Monday through Friday) before your appointment. If you have an urgent last-minute appointment, call as soon as you can.

You can get rides for doctor appointments, medical services such as lab or X-ray, and picking up medications or medical equipment. This benefit is limited to Kaiser Medicare members who had coverage through an employer or who were also on Medi-Cal.

New veterans' benefits



The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced that veterans under 40, who may have been exposed to burn pits and other toxins during their service, are now eligible for breast cancer risk assessments and mammograms at VA medical centers, reported Congressman John Garamendi.

Honoring Our PACT Act (H.R.3967) is the largest expansion of veterans care and benefits in decades as toxic-exposed veterans are eligible for additional screenings and health services. How does the PACT Act help me?

The Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act of 2022 is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances. Exploring the Future of Electric Rates in California webinar

Assembly Bill 205 (2022) removed the existing cap on fixed charges for residential electric rates, required the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to consider a tiered fixed charge option based on income (so lower-income ratepayers receive higher savings) by July 2024, and to move forward with creating a framework to enable demand flexibility. Thus far, the CPUC has approved new Rate Design Principles—updating longstanding precedents—and crafted principles for Demand Flexibility, setting the foundation for the proceeding to move forward.

Following the creation of Guiding Principles, the CPUC solicited proposals for the first version of a residential fixed charge that includes: which rate components should be included in a fixed charge, how many income brackets are appropriate, and how to implement such a fixed charge. The Clean Coalition advanced a reasonable and easy-to-implement fixed charge; almost every other party proposed a significantly more expensive fixed charge that would require major changes to implement. Given that electric rates are unaffordable—and still skyrocketing—in California, it is important to understand the future of rate design and what the path to electrification looks like.

The webinar will take place on Tuesday, August 15 from 11am to noon.

This webinar will cover:

- The background of the Demand Flexibility proceeding and why a Fixed Charge is being proposed based on personal income.
- The Clean Coalition's modest fixed fee proposal and the methodology behind it.
- Why rates should primarily be volumetric in nature and what the main drivers of increasing rates are.
- How high fixed charge proposals would result in net losses for most residential customers and upend the incentive to conserve energy.

 The key correlation between rates and electrification; improper rate reform could render electrification financially infeasible.

Those interested should contact the Aging and Disability Resource Connection at (707) 200-7116. Callers need to leave a message so an intake coordinator can return the call and administer a brief intake questionnaire to determine if the person is eligible to receive a device. Devices are reserved for the most at-risk individuals as numbers are limited.


