These losses are incomprehensible to our communities. There are seldom any words that can be offered as comfort or balm when things like this happen. I wish the families of these victims some semblance of peace in the face of these tragic and senseless losses.

Women's History Month - recognizing Gloria Molina



On this last Friday of Women's History Month I am recognizing Gloria Molina. She made history as being the first Latina elected to the LA City council, the LA County Board of Supervisors, and the State Assembly.

Ms. Molina started her political life in the 1970's as an activist in the Chicano movement and advocated for Mexican-American women who were sterilized against their will at the LA County USC Medical Center.

Ms. Gloria is given credit as a major force behind the creation of Grand Park. This is an area that stretches three blocks between City Hall and the Music Center in Los Angeles.

She recently wrote on her Facebook that she has been battling terminal cancer for the last three years. She is now preparing for a "transition in life." She also wrote: "I've lived a long, fulfilling and beautiful life."

I believe all of us would like to say those words when it is our time.

Cesar Chavez Day is today

Today, March 31, is Cesar Chavez's birthday. He was a civil rights activist, Latino, and farm labor leader. He co-founded the National Farm Workers Association. I remember growing up and to support the movement - we did not buy nor eat grapes.

Benicia Fire Department is hiring: The Benicia Fire Department is now hiring paramedic firefighters at the academy/non-lateral, lateral, or trainee levels. The first round of applications will be reviewed on April 12.

Low-cost Lyft rides in Benicia: If you are age 65+, a veteran, or disabled, you qualify for \$4 Lyft rides around Benicia. Additionally, if you qualify as low-income, Lyft rides are only \$3. To apply for either voucher, call 1-800-535-6883.

Even if you do not qualify for either voucher, Lyft rides around Benicia are still just \$5. Enter the code 5BENICIA before paying.

All low-cost Lyft rides are good from 6am to 9pm.

Electric vehicle pilot program in Fairfield

In partnership with Solano Transit Authority (STA), the city of Fairfield will soon begin construction on a number of electric vehicle chargers around Fairfield that will be available for public use.
