3. COUNTYWIDE INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN UPDATE

<u>COUNTYWIDE SITING ELEMENT (CSE)</u>: The California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (AB 939), as amended (Section 40000 et seq. of the California Public Resources Code), requires each county to prepare a Countywide Siting Element that describes how the county, and the cities within the county, plan to manage the disposal of their solid waste for a 15-year planning period. The CSE must be approved by a majority of the cities containing a majority of the incorporated population in the county by City Council Resolution, the Solano County Board of Supervisors, and the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle).

- 1995-2009 Solano County CSE (November 1995): California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) – Approved 1996
- 2010-2025 Solano County CSE (July 2011): CalRecycle – Approved 2012

4. SB 1383 CAPACITY PLANNING UPDATE

Capacity Planning for Food Recovery 2024-2029

SB 1383 regulations require counties, and each jurisdiction located within the county, meaning cities, regional agencies, and special districts that provide solid waste collection services, to plan for adequate edible food recovery capacity.
