

## 2024 Statewide Primary Election Notice of Measures

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the following measures will be submitted to the voters of Solano County at the Statewide Primary Election to be held on March 5, 2024.

Measure A - City of Benicia

"Benicia Hotel Tax

Shall the City of Benicia enact a measure protecting essential Benicia services, including:

- maintaining police services
- protecting 911 response times
- maintaining local parks and library services
- promoting economic development

by adopting an ordinance increasing the transient occupancy tax, paid by hotels and vacation rentals, from 9% to 13%, paid only by guests and tourists, providing approximately \$250,000 annually for general governmental purposes, sunsetting in twelve years, subject to accountability by annual audits and an independent citizens' oversight committee?"

Measure B - City of Benicia

"Benicia Public Safety and Essential Services Measures

To protect Benicia's essential public safety, city services, and facilities including:

- maintaining police services,
- protecting 911 and fire emergency response times,
- maintaining local parks
- preserving recreation and library services,
- sustaining other vital city programs,

shall the City of Benicia enact a measure, by adopting a 3/4 cent sales tax, for general government purposes, providing approximately \$5,400,000 annually, under local control, with citizens' oversight and annual audits, with a sunset date of twelve years?"

Measure C - Benicia Unified School District

"To improve the quality of education, upgrade, renovate, and modernize classrooms, restrooms and school facilities; repair/replace leaky roofs; renovate/construct science and career technical

classrooms/labs; and replace outdated HVAC systems; shall Benicia Unified School District's measure authorizing \$122,500,000 of bonds be adopted at legal rates, generating on average \$7,500,000 per year while bonds are outstanding, at approximately \$60 per \$100,000 assessed value, with annual audits, independent oversight, NO money for salaries, and all money staying local?"

**NOTICE** is given that December 15<sup>th</sup> is the last day to file arguments for or against measures. Arguments are not to exceed 300 words in length. Arguments for or against Measures A and B shall be filed with the Benicia City Clerk's Office, no later than 5:00 P.M. Arguments for Measure C shall be filed with the Solano County Registrar of Voters, no later than 5:00 P.M.

December 19<sup>th</sup> is the last day to file rebuttal arguments for or against measures. Rebuttal arguments are not to exceed 250 words in length. Rebuttal arguments for Measures A and B shall be filed with the Benicia City Clerk's Office, no later than 5:00 P.M. Rebuttal arguments for Measure C shall be filed with the Solano County Registrar of Voters, no later than 5:00 P.M. The viewing period will commence immediately afterward.

In accordance with section 9600 of the California Elections Code, all arguments and rebuttals filed pursuant to this notice shall be accompanied by a signature statement form to be signed by each author.

On March 5, 2024, the polls will be open between 7:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M.
