Women's History Month moment



Marian Cleeves Diamond (November 11, 1926 – July 25, 2017) was an American scientist and educator who is considered one of the founders of modern neuroscience. She and her team were the first to publish evidence that the brain can change with experience and improve with enrichment, what is now called neuroplasticity. Her research on the brain of Albert Einstein helped fuel the ongoing scientific revolution in understanding the roles of glial cells in the brain. She was a professor of anatomy at the University of California, Berkeley. Other published research explored differences

between the cerebral cortex of male and female rats and the link between positive thinking and immune health.

Dr. Diamond's research fundamentally changed the field of neuroscience by proving the plasticity of the human brain for the first time. She discovered that an enriched environment alters the anatomy of the brain. Dr. Diamond subsequently showed that the brain continues to adapt and develop well into adulthood. This ran counter to the contemporary paradigm in neuroscience of the brain as a static organ that deteriorates over time.

In addition to her groundbreaking research, Dr. Diamond was well known for her dedication to educating and inspiring the next generation of scientists. Dr. Diamond served as director of the Lawrence Hall of Science from 1990 to 1996, she understood the importance of creating an enriching learning environment for young people. Dr. Diamond oversaw the development of math and science curricula that reached students across the nation and around the world.

"She shared her personal story of how hard it had been for her, as a woman, to move forward in science, and championed the Hall's programs to support girls and others who are underrepresented in the sciences. She continually challenged Hall staff to learn something new each day, and to share it with our colleagues, visitors, and everyone we met" says Susan Gregory, deputy director of the Hall.

Dr. Diamond, a famous female figure in California's history has published work exploring the link between positive thinking and immunity, as well as women's role in science.



Notice of Public Availability of 2023 Refinery Flare Minimization Plan Annual Updates

BAY AREA AIR QUALITY The Bay Area Air Quality Management District is releasing the 2023 Flare Minimization Plan (FMP) Annual Updates for public review and comment. The five Bay Area refineries prepared these plans subject to Regulation 12, Rule 12: Flares at Refineries.

Under Regulation 12-12, each FMP Annual Update must include:

- New prevention measures identified during investigations of flaring events that occurred during the period July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023;
- A description of the prevention measures previously taken or currently planned to reduce flare emissions at the refinery;
- Commitment to implement all new feasible prevention measures expeditiously; and
- A 30-day public comment review period

The plan updates are now available for review on the Air District's Flare Minimization Plans web page.

The deadline to submit public comments regarding the 2023 FMP Annual Updates is **April 8, 2024**.

Be sure to identify which refinery, or refineries, your comment is applicable to.

After consideration of public comments received, the Air District will evaluate each refinery's Flare Minimization Plan Annual Update to determine whether it meets the requirements of Regulation 12-12 and will take final action in accordance with the regulation.

Internship for high school students



Bay Area high school students are invited to apply to the Norman Mineta Bay Area Summer Academy, a five-week paid internship with MTC, the

Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), the Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District).

The program kicks off at the Bay Area Metro Center on July 8, 2024, and over the course of the subsequent five weeks, students will learn how regional agencies deals with issues like environmental justice, housing and transportation equity, community health, and social justice. High school students are encouraged to apply before the application deadline on April 28, 2024.(link is external)

To apply for the Bay Area Summer Academy, students must:

- Live and attend high school in the Bay Area.
- Be at least 16 years old.
- Have completed the ninth grade by July 2024.
- Be able to attend online and in-person seminars and present on a topic related to the seminars.
- Have the permission of a parent or guardian to participate if the student is under 18.

Enrollment is limited, and selections will emphasize a diversity of perspectives from students across the Bay Area. Grade point averages are not considered.

2024-25 College Journalism Network Fellowship

Are you an undergraduate student journalist at a California college or university? Do you want to gain valuable experience covering higher education, work with other student journalists from around the state and see your stories published by CalMatters?

The <u>CalMatters College Journalism Network</u> is hiring fellows for its 2024-2025 cohort, which begins mid-August and runs through May.

You will take part in ambitious joint reporting projects with other fellows, as well as covering stories on your own. And you'll receive training in reporting, higher education policy and navigating the journalism industry.

Fellows devote an average of 10-15 hours per week to the remote fellowship, with a flexible schedule and a stipend of \$1200 per month. Expect to attend weekly, virtual newsroom meetings with the rest of the CJN team, and at least one in-depth, expenses-paid training in Sacramento at the beginning of the program.

This year, as team co-captains and coaches, they built and trained a large team that

collectively won fourth overall in tournament points earned, beating out many larger and well-established teams in the Bay Area.

A month before the end of the debate season, they decided to join forces again and debate as a team. The outcome of that was once again impressive. They were among the top two teams out of 32 in state qualifiers for the Bay Area, earning a place in state-wide finals, which will take place in Clovis April 12-14.

As they celebrated that huge win, they got word that they were chosen to go to the national finals in New York City on April 6-8 where they will compete against the best parliamentary debate teams in the country.

This end-of-year performance means travel expenses to two overnight tournaments, one of which requires airfare and other travel-related expenses.

Now they need the support once again of our community to end the year in New York City proudly representing Benicia in a tournament they have already started training for.



Fairfield joins GovAl Coalition

The city of Fairfield has joined the GovAl Coalition, a growing network of more than 400 public servants from over 150 agencies committed to responsible and purposeful Al in the public sector, the city announced this week. The Coalition is focused on establishing standards for Al policies, procurement, implementation, and ensuring public privacy to advance the use of Al in delivering government services.



The city of San José launched the Coalition in 2023 to create

standards for responsible and purposeful AI in government and the Coalition evolved into a national movement for AI in the public sector. The Coalition has released an open letter and a toolkit to help public agencies adopt and implement responsible AI practices. These tools are aligned with emerging national standards and unify the needs of many local governments.

The next step for the Coalition includes putting the toolkit to practice and implementing AI solutions to enhance civic services and public engagement. The City of Fairfield and the GovAI Coalition welcomes agencies to join our efforts in shaping the future of artificial intelligence.




