

REASONS WHY THIS PROJECT IS EXEMPT:

The California Environmental Quality Act (Section 21000, et. seq. of the California Public Resources Code, hereafter CEQA) requires analysis of agency approvals of discretionary "projects." A "project," under CEQA, is defined as "the whole of an action, which has a potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment." The proposed action is a project under CEQA and is exempt from CEQA under CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301 "Existing Facilities", and 15302 "Replacement and Reconstruction". The project is fully within public right of way and provides minor alteration of existing public structures, involves no expansion of existing use or capacity, and the project scope is for the purpose of rehabilitating sanitary sewer and storm drain lines by the cured-in-place (CIPP) method.
