Buffalo Soldiers coming to Peña Adobe



Buffalo Soldiers are coming Pena Adobe Park on Saturday, July 6, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Pena Adobe Park, 4699 Pena Adobe Road.

Company G of the 10th Cavalry, better known to history as the Buffalo Soldiers, will be riding out of western history and into Peña Adobe Park again this year. The Buffalo Soldiers are a living history group that was established in the Sacramento area almost 30 years ago. The group recreates the black cavalry units that served in the Old West from 1866 to 1891.

Company G's goal is to tell the story of the Buffalo Soldiers' history visiting schools, community organizations, churches and public events.

They will have two tables with artifacts of the buffalo soldiers' history on display and members, dressed in the uniform depicting 1874, will be on hand to talk with park visitors.

In addition to the Buffalo Soldiers, the Solano County Sheriffs' Posse will be at Peña Adobe.

The Sheriffs' Posse has been part of the Solano County Sheriffs' Office for more than 70 years and is comprised of volunteers who use their horses and equipment to help the department with search-and-rescue efforts, emergency services and as public ambassadors.

California Invests More than \$2 Billion to Fuel Economic Opportunity, Increase Access & Protect the State's Vital Transportation Infrastructure



The California Transportation Commission (CTC) this week approved more than \$2billion to improve and maintain a transportation system that serves as the backbone for the world's fifth largest economy. The approved funding will support the next generation of transportation projects,

ranging from bridge maintenance and rail system upgrades to enhanced railroad safety

features and increased access for bicyclists and pedestrians.

These benefits will help power economic opportunity as well as mitigate the effects of climate change. The latest allocations include more than \$483 million from the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 (IIJA) and approximately \$443 million from Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

Solano County:

\$7,405,000 allocation on State Routes 29, 37, 80, and 780 at various locations. This project will install Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs), Advanced Warning Beacons (AWBs), and Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons (PHBs), modify free right-turn lanes, and upgrade crosswalk markings. These pedestrian and bicyclist enhancements will reduce the number and severity of collisions.

\$4,900,000 allocation on State Routes 12, 29, 37, 80, 113, 505, and 780 in various locations. This project will install Accessible Pedestrian Signal (APS) systems and countdown timers and upgrade crosswalk markings. These pedestrian enhancements will reduce the number and severity of collisions within marked crosswalks at signalized intersections.

\$2,547,000 allocation at the Vallejo Maintenance Station, Fairfield Maintenance Station, and Dixon Maintenance Station. This project will replace perimeter fencing, gates, and masonry walls to improve security measures

Only I wasn't really talking to an Xfinity employee. A few weeks later, my Wi-Fi stopped working. I contacted Xfinity again and the

representative told me the company discontinued my internet for nonpayment."

Minority Health Month



July is BIPOC/Minority Mental Health Month, a time dedicated to raising awareness about the unique mental health challenges faced by historically underserved and underrepresented populations

including Black, Indigenous, Hispanic/Latino/a/x and People of Color.

This month, Solano County Behavioral Health will focus on promoting equitable mental health care and addressing the disparities that exist in services for these communities who often encounter barriers to mental health care, including stigma, cultural misunderstandings, and lack of access to culturally and linguistically responsive services.

In Solano, approximately 61% of the county population is identified as a race other than White/Caucasian. Persons who are Caucasian/White represent 39% of the population; 26% Hispanic/Latino; 14% African American/Black, 14% Asian American/Pacific Islander (AAPI); and 6% other race/ethnicity groups. At least 43% of the population speaks a language other than English often benefitting from linguistically appropriate or preferred services.

The <u>Draft 2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)</u> is a funding document that helps implement the public's policy and investment priorities reflected in <u>Plan Bay Area 2050</u>, the region's long-range plan. Updated every two years, the TIP reflects the Bay Area's near-term transportation investment priorities and helps some of the most significant projects and programs become a reality. It includes projects that support all modes of travel, such as transit, highways, bridges, local streets and roads, biking, walking and freight movement.

The Draft Transportation-Air Quality Conformity Analysis for the 2025 TIP is also available for public comment. The Conformity Analysis demonstrates that both the TIP and the plan comply with federal transportation air quality regulations.

The public comment period for both documents will remain open through 5 p.m. on Friday, July 26, 2024.


The information provided will allow Benicia PD to enter notes into a confidential database regarding an individual and the related address, that can be used to the benefit of emergency personnel/officers and the person noted.

Benicia PD's goal is to have positive and safe interactions with community members, and the registration form has the option to provide specific and detailed information including any unique needs or behaviors.

You can provide as much or as little information as you wish, but the more information that is provided, the better the PD can serve the community. All information is kept confidential. You are encouraged to also submit a current photo with the registration form. Once registered, Benicia PD will send an email on an annual basis to update the information provided.

STA Board Approves Solano Rail Crossing Plan & Vallejo Passenger Rail Study



On June 12, 2024, the Solano Transportation Authority (STA) Board approved the *Vallejo Passenger Rail Study*. The study found that there is a significant travel demand from Vallejo to the North Bay counties, specifically to Napa and Solano through the Solano Rail Hub.

The Study recommends working with regional and state partners to advocate for the inclusion of rail service in Vallejo in the next California State Rail Plan. The STA and the City of Vallejo have identified future engagement with Caltrans, the Capitol Corridor Joint Powers Authority, and the appropriate adjacent counties to begin working on advancing concepts of rail service in Vallejo.

Lecture/Tour: Absorbing the Shock of Port Chicago: Losing Weapons Transshipments Across the Pacific Theater



The Allied invasion of Europe was a little over one month old and the Pacific Campaign was ramping up when a tremendous explosion obliterated the Navy's ammunition transshipment facility at Port Chicago in the North Bay Area of San Francisco. In an instant, 320 lives were snuffed out and the supply of needed ammunition was cut off to the largest battlefield the world had ever seen.



Soltrans eliminates paper passes

On Monday, July 1, Solano County Transit (SolTrans) will eliminate paper passes as a fare payment option on all Local Routes and



Express Lines. Paper passes will continue to be accepted on Paratransit buses.

This crucial change is part of their broader strategy to modernize public transportation in Solano County and ensure a smoother, more efficient ride for all passengers. SolTrans already offers several digital fare payment methods to ensure a seamless transition for its riders:

- <u>Token Transit</u>: A user-friendly mobile app allowing riders to purchase and activate passes directly from their smartphones. Simply download the app, purchase your fare, show the activated pass to the driver, and board your bus. It's that easy – Tap, Show, and GO!
- Clipper Card: A versatile contactless smart card that supports both cash value and various passes. The Clipper Card is the all-in-one transit card used for contactless fare payments throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.
- Clipper START Card: A means-based fare program
 offering eligible riders a 50% discount.
 For those who prefer traditional payment methods,
 SolTrans will continue to accept exact cash and coins for
 purchasing one-way fares and day passes onboard all local
 and express buses.

In November 2023, the SolTrans Board approved the initiative to go paperless. Starting in January 2024, SolTrans staff began extensive outreach efforts to inform and assist riders with the transition. These efforts included hosted events at the Vallejo Transit Center (VTC), where staff provided hands-on assistance and information about the new digital fare options. This proactive approach ensures that riders are well-prepared and comfortable with the upcoming changes.

All SolTrans paper passes expire and are not refundable or exchangeable. Current passes expire Sunday, June 30, 2024, and will no longer be valid for travel after the expiration date.


