VOTING OPTIONS FOR ALL VOTERS

In an effort to provide a safe voting environment, the Solano County Registrar of Voters has prepared several voting options for all voters. You have received a Vote by Mail ballot for the election in this packet.

Below is a description of the different options you have for voting to help provide a safe voting environment for all voters, our staff, and our community partners:

No Contact Voting:

As an option to in-person voting, all voters can vote from the safety of their home, using the enclosed ballot. Ballots can be returned to our office in one of three manners:



Ballot Drop-Off:

Starting October 7th through Election Day (29 days) - Ballot drop-off times and locations are identified on the next page (drop box is inside an office building).



Curbside Drop-off:

Starting October 31st through Election Day (5 days) - Curbside drop-off times and locations are identified on the next page (stay in your vehicle, hand ballot to poll workers).

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Election Day Drop-Off:

Election Day (1 day) - Poll Place drop-off locations are available on Election Day-all locations are open from 7a.m. to 8p.m.

All ballots must be received or post-marked by Election Day. All postage is paid by the Registrar of Voters Office for voters mailing ballots back to our office. Voters do not have to vote this ballot, and can still choose to vote in-person using one of the options listed below.

Limited Contact Voting:



At your assigned poll place, you can request to vote "curbside" from the comfort of your vehicle. Look for the blue cone outside of your polling place, and call the number listed on the cone. Poll workers will come out to your vehicle with your ballot and will securely deposit it for you.

This same curbside option is available if you want to drop off your Vote by Mail ballot. It may be preferable for you to remain in your vehicle and we support that option.

In-Person Voting:

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Traditional polling places are still available. Your assigned location is included on the cover sheet with your official ballot. Some voters may experience additional wait times due to the need to provide social distancing within the voting location. Please be prepared: it may take longer than usual to vote at your polling place.

If you need assistance ...

As a voter, you may bring up to two individuals with you to your polling place to help you cast your ballot, as long as those individuals do not represent your employer or your union. Your polling place will have copies of the ballot in Spanish and Tagalog and may have poll workers ready to assist you who speak Spanish and Tagalog.

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WHAT OFFICES ARE ON THIS BALLOT?

In the November Statewide General Election, all voters receive the same ballot, no matter what political party you are registered with (or if you have no party preference). The address where you are registered to vote determines which local contests are on your ballot.

In the March Primary Election, all Californians were able to vote to decide which candidates for state and local offices moved on to the November General Election.

IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASUR	REL	

Measure L is the "Fairfield Business License Modernization and Simplification Measure." Measure L was placed on the ballot by a unanimous vote of the City Council. If approved by the voters, this Measure would amend the Fairfield Municipal Code to update the City's business license structure, and increase the rates of business license tax paid by businesses in the City.

The City of Fairfield, like many cities, requires businesses that operate in the City to obtain a business license, and pay an annual business license tax to help support the City's infrastructure, programs, and services. In a 2024 City Council study session on the issue, staff informed the City Council that the structure and tax rates have not been changed since 1984. The current business license tax ordinance includes a structure that determines business license tax rates based on multiple tiered rates for different types of businesses and levels of gross annual revenue. Measure L would reduce the number of tiers of businesses, and simplify administration of the ordinance. Business license tax rates would increase by various amounts specified in Measure L for businesses in each of the new tiers. The rates for smaller businesses would be less than for larger businesses.

The business license tax is a general tax, which means the tax revenue can be spent for all general governmental purposes. The City estimated that this Measure will raise approximately \$1,000,000 per year in new local revenue for use in the City. The City Council's adopted ballot question states this new revenue could be used to protect essential City services, including fixing potholes and maintaining streets; maintaining 9-1-1 response times; city park maintenance; senior and youth programs; and other general government purposes.

Measure L would permit the City Council to make other adjustments to the business license ordinance that do not increase the tax rates above what is allowed by Measure L. In the future, tax rates would be adjusted annually to reflect CPI increases. Measure L would be in effect until ended by the voters. Revenue from Measure L is subject to the City's annual budget and audit requirements.

Article XIIIC of the California Constitution, commonly known as Proposition 218, requires that the proposed general tax be approved by a majority of the voters voting on the Measure. A "yes" vote on Measure L is to amend the business license

WHEREAS, Fairfield is a full-service city, equipped with its own City-run police, fire, park, public works including water utility services; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairfield faces a structural budget deficit that it is trying to solve; and

WHEREAS, the general fund pays for important City services such as police, fire, and paramedic services; 911 emergency response; emergency street repairs and maintenance; neighborhood park and recreation services; and general municipal services to the public; and

WHEREAS, the City proposes modernize and simplify the Business License Tax, until ended by voters, as directed by City Council; and

Section 7. Arguments for or against this measure shall be submitted not later than 5 p.m. on August 16, 2024, to the City Clerk.

Section 8. The City Council adopts the provisions of subdivision (a) of Section 9285 of the Elections Code to permit rebuttal arguments if arguments have been filed in favor of and against the measure which is being submitted to the voters of the City at this special election. Rebuttal arguments shall be filed not later than 5:00 p.m. on August 20, 2024.

CITY ATTORNEY'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE M

Measure M is the "Fairfield Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Measure." If approved by the voters, this Measure would amend Fairfield's existing Transient Occupancy Tax Ordinance (the "TOT Ordinance") to increase the rate of the City's TOT by two percent. The TOT is paid by guests who occupy, or have the right to occupy, hotels, inns, or other short-term lodgings within the City for 30 consecutive calendar days or fewer. The current TOT rate is ten percent (10%). This Measure would increase the TOT rate to twelve percent (12%).

At the proposed new rate, for example, a hotel stay costing a guest \$100 would generate a tax of \$12, instead of the current \$10. The TOT is collected from the lodging guests and paid to the City by operators of such lodgings.

The Measure would be a general tax, which means the tax revenue could be spent for all general governmental purposes. The City estimated that this Measure will raise approximately \$600,000 per year in new local revenue for use in the City. The City Council's adopted ballot question states this new revenue would be used to protect essential City services, including pothole/street repair; fire protection/9-1-1 response; neighborhood police patrols; city park maintenance; senior and youth programs; and for general government use.

Measure M would permit the City Council to adjust the TOT to a rate that is less than 12%, but not higher, without further voter approval. WHEREAS, the tax was established in 1965 and the current 10% tax rate was last adjusted 40 years ago in 1984 and the proposed increase to 12% will bring it in line with neighboring communities; and

WHEREAS, the proposed, locally enacted, Transient Occupancy Tax measure is projected to generate additional general fund revenue of approximately \$600,000 annually for a two percent rate increase; and

WHEREAS, local, voter-approved funding for essential services will provide a local source of additional funding for the City of Fairfield that cannot be taken by the State and all funds would stay in Fairfield for local services and infrastructure only; and

WHEREAS, the proposed measure will be subject to fiscal accountability protections such as public disclosure of all spending; mandatory annual audits that ensure funds are used effectively and as promised and only to benefit the Fairfield community; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Revenue and Taxation Code Section 7280 the City of Fairfield ("City") has the authority to levy a Transient Occupancy Tax for general purposes, and subject to voter approval; and

WHEREAS, the general rule is that a Transient Occupancy Tax must be placed on a regularly scheduled general election for members of the council, unless the council adopts a resolution proclaiming a fiscal emergency; and

WHEREAS, at the March 12, 2024, City Council Study Session, the council directed staff to bring back approval of Transient Occupancy Tax and Business License Tax Modernization and Simplification Ballot measures to a future council meeting to be considered for submission to the voters at the November 2024 election; and

WHEREAS, if Fairfield's measure passes, then the Transient Occupancy Tax rate will be 12 percent; and

WHEREAS, the TOT is not imposed on Fairfield residents, rather it is imposed on occupants of hotels, inns, Airbnb, and other short-term lodging facilities for stays of 29 days or less. The TOT is applied to a customer's lodging bill. The TOT is a general tax that is deposited into the City's general fund.

WHEREAS, to qualify for the ballot, 2/3 of the City Council (Five members) are required to vote affirmatively for the Transient Occupancy Tax ordinance. If a council member is absent from the meeting, Five City Council Members are still required to vote affirmatively for the item to qualify for the ballot; and

WHEREAS, if so, approved by the council, and then passed by the voters on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, with a majority of voters (50% plus 1) supporting the measure, it would go into effect on January 1, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD HEREBY RESOLVES:

Section 1. The City Council pursuant to its right and authority, does order to be submitted to the voters at the General

Measure M:

Fairfield Essential Services Protection Measure. To protect essential city services such as pothole/street repair; fire protection/9-1-1 response; neighborhood police patrols; city park maintenance; senior and youth programs; and for general government use, shall the ordinance be adopted updating Fairfield's existing transient occupancy (hotel) tax, paid only by hotel/lodging guests, from 10% to 12%, until ended by voters, providing approximately \$600,000 annually, that cannot be taken by the State, including annual independent audits?

Section 2. The proposed measure submitted to the voters is hereby approved in Ordinance 2024-05, which is incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. The City will reimburse the county for the actual cost incurred in conducting the election upon receipt of a bill stating the amount due as determined by the election's official.

Section 4. In all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

Section 5. Notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

Section 6. Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9280, the council hereby directs the city clerk to transmit a copy of the measure to the city attorney. The city attorney shall prepare an impartial analysis of the measure, not to exceed 500 words in length, showing the effect of the measure on the existing law and the operation of the measure, and transmit such impartial analysis to the city clerk not later than 5 p.m. on August 14, 2024.

Section 7. Arguments for or against this measure shall be submitted not later than 5 p.m. on August 16, 2024, to the city clerk.

Section 8. The council adopts the provisions of subdivision (a) of Section 9285 of the Elections Code to permit rebuttal arguments if arguments have been filed in favor of and against the measure which is being submitted to the voters of the City at this special election. Rebuttal arguments shall be filed not later than 5:00 p.m. on August 20, 2024.

Section 9. The city clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Solano County Board of Supervisors and the Solano County Registrar of Voters.

Section 10. This action is Categorically Exempt per CEQA Section 21080(b)(9); 15300 which applies to any project that has been determined not to have significant effect on the environment and exempt from this division.

VOTER BILL of **RIGHTS**

YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS

- The right to vote if you are a registered voter. You are eligible to vote if you are:
 - 🛧 a U.S. citizen living in California
 - \star at least 18 years old
 - ★ registered where you currently live
- ★ not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony, and
- not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- 2. The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list.

You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.

- 3. The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.
- 4. **The right to cast a secret ballot** without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.
- The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:
 Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot,
 Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place, or
 Vote using a provisional ballot.
- 6. **The right to get help casting your ballot** from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.
- 7. The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in California.
- 8. **The right to get election materials in a language other than English** if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.
- 9. The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.
- 10. **The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity** to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

SPECIAL NOTICE

- Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on the day indicated in the posted county Voter Information Guide.
- Specific instructions on how to vote, including how to cast a provisional ballot, can be obtained from a poll worker or by reading the information mailed to you by your local elections official.
- If you are a newly registered voter, you may be asked to provide appropriate identification or other documentation according to federal law. But please note that every individual has the right to cast a provisional ballot even if he or she does not provide the documentation.
- It is against the law to represent yourself as being eligible to vote unless you meet all of the requirements to vote under federal and state law.
- It is against the law to tamper with voting equipment.

TIME OFF TO VOTE

POLLS ARE OPEN FROM 7:00 A.M. TO 8:00 P.M. EACH ELECTION DAY

If you are scheduled to be at work during that time and you do not have sufficient time outside of working hours to vote at a statewide election, California law allows you to take up to two hours off to vote, without losing any pay.

You may take as much time as you need to vote, but only two hours of that time will be paid.

Your time off for voting can be only at the beginning or end of your regular work shift, whichever allows the most free time for voting and the least time off from your regular working shift, unless you make another arrangement with your employer.

If three working days before the election you think you will need time off to vote, you must notify your employer at least two working days prior to the election.

ATTENTION VOTERS





Solano County is required to provide a translated copy of the official ballots to voters in both Spanish and Tagalog. Any voter in Solano County can request a copy of this ballot for any precinct in the election. Requests can be made at any time. Translated ballots will be delivered at least 10 days before Election Day.
