

Nighttime Lane Closures Scheduled for the Interstate 80 Express Lane Project For Paving Work



Caltrans has scheduled nightly lane closures on Eastbound and Westbound I-80 between Air Base Parkway in Fairfield and Leisure Town Rd in Vacaville. The work is scheduled nightly between Monday to Saturdays.

Crews will be paving and striping the final stretch for the I-80 Express project. Various traffic lanes on eastbound and westbound I-80 will be closed at various times overnight.

At least one traffic lane on westbound I-80 and one traffic lane on eastbound I-80 will always remain open. This paving work will continue through Fall 2024.

The I-80 Express Lanes project is on-going and is estimated to be completed by Fall 2025. All work is weather and dependent. Please be advised that temporary striping will be placed on the highway for the lane lines until the paving and final striping is complete.

Americans Have Just Weeks Left Until New Social Security Rule Goes into Effect

A change to <u>Social Security applications</u> is going into effect at the end of the month.

About 70 million people receive <u>Social Security payments</u> every year, with some qualifying for <u>Supplemental Security Income</u> (SSI) if they're disabled or <u>senior Americans</u> who meet certain eligibility requirements. One of the eligibility requirements stipulates that Americans cannot earn more than \$1,971 in income per month to qualify for the payments. However, that rule is changing slightly.

Homebound Books



The Benicia Public Library is initiating the "Homebound Books" program. This initiative aims to bring library resources directly to older adults and individuals with disabilities who are unable to visit the library in person.

Nationally, older adults are among the most frequent users of public libraries, yet many encounter difficulties physically accessing library facilities due to age-related mobility issues or disabilities. The "Homebound Books" program aims to bridge this gap by delivering library materials directly to their homes.

How it works:

- Fill out the online application.
- Based on your responses staff will curate personalized book selections. If you request specific titles, we will try to fulfill those requests before creating a personalized list.
- Check-outs will be limited to 5 items per patron, including books, audiobooks, magazines, and movies.
- Deliveries are provided once a month, on the second Wednesday, from 5 to 8 p.m.

Special instructions will be made available for delivery in case patrons want contactless delivery, as well as to note any information that will allow for a smooth, efficient delivery.

Those temporarily homebound due to injury or health condition, are welcome to apply for this service if they will be unable to get to the library for six or more weeks.

Vallejo Fire Department First to Administer Life-Saving TXA in Solano County

The Vallejo Fire Department is proud to announce that our Firefighter Paramedics are the first medical professionals in Solano County to administer Tranexamic Acid (TXA), a groundbreaking medication used to reduce uncontrolled bleeding in trauma patients.


Introduced at the end of August 2024, TXA has already been successfully administered three times, with each case yielding positive results.

TXA works by stabilizing blood clots, preventing excessive blood loss in patients with severe injuries. Its timely administration can be critical in improving patient outcomes, giving trauma victims a better chance of survival during transport to local area hospitals. The Vallejo Fire Department's use of TXA marks a significant leap forward in emergency medical care within the region.

Fire Chief Drayton stated, "We are incredibly proud to be the first in Solano County to administer TXA. This life-saving drug enhances the advanced care our paramedics deliver to the community, ensuring the highest level of emergency response when every second counts."

The Vallejo Fire Department remains committed to adopting leading-edge medical practices, and the introduction of TXA reflects the department's ongoing dedication to improving patient care in the field.

City of Vallejo seeks applicants for Measure P Citizens' Oversight Committee

A city of Vallejo press release:

On July 12, 2022, the Vallejo City Council created a Citizens' Oversight Committee (COC). The COC shall consist of 7 regular members appointed by the Mayor and City Council as set forth in the ordinance



(Ordinance No. 1866 N.C. (2d)). Six of the regular members are appointed based upon Council voting district. Members appointed by the Mayor may reside anywhere in the City.

Due to terms expiring on October 10, 2024, the City is seeking qualified District 1, 3 and 6 applicants and one at-large applicant interested in serving on the Commission each for a 2-year term.

Citizens' Oversight Committee

The COC is established to independently review and advise upon the City's expenditure of proceeds generated by the transactions and use tax. The Committee shall meet at least twice each calendar year and more frequently, if necessary, to discharge the responsibilities of the Committee. Members of the Committee shall not receive a stipend for their service. Any additional responsibilities and duties of the Committee shall be established by resolution of the City Council except as otherwise set forth in Vallejo Municipal Code Section 3.09.170.

The COC shall annually review and report on (a) the City's proposed and actual expenditure of proceeds generated by the transaction and use tax and (b) the independent annual audit required by Chapter 3.09. The Committee's report shall be submitted to the City Council for review and discussion at a public meeting of the City Council and shall be available to the public.

The City shall provide such staff resources as are reasonably necessary to assist the Committee with the discharge of its duties under this chapter. The Committee shall not have authority to hire or retain its own staff, consultants, or contractors.

Qualifications to be a Committee Member

Members shall be residents of the corresponding Council District of the appointing Councilmember for Districts 1, 3 and 6. A member appointed by the Mayor may reside anywhere in the City. Each member of the

Committee shall serve for a term of 2 years and such service shall be at the pleasure of the City Council.

Applications will remain open until 5 p.m., Friday, October 4, 2024.

Interview dates will be announced shortly after the application closes. Applicants must attend the interview in order to be considered for appointment to the COC.

Officer Matthew Bowen Memorial Traffic Signal



Play 4 All Park, in partnership with Officer Matthew Bowen's family and friends, are seeking donations to build a solar-powered signal that will be located in the main rotunda (to be re-named "Bowen Blvd."), and will operate like a regular control signal, helping children learn crossing safety.

A commemorative bronze plaque will be placed on the signal. If donations exceed the original goal, funds will be used to build a pedestrian crossing signal.

Matthew (Matt) Bowen was born in Fairfield, California, on April 10th, 1992. He was raised in Fairfield and attended Rodriguez High School. He then went on to pursue his dream of becoming a police officer. In 2019, Matt graduated from the Napa Police Academy and began his career with the Concord Police Department.

Following the police academy, Matt earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Arizona State University while working full-time as a Police Officer. In 2023, Matt transferred to the Vacaville Police Department to work closer to home to spend more time with his wife and kids. In January 2024, Matt began training to become a motorcycle traffic officer. On July 11th, 2024, Matt tragically lost his life when he was killed in the line of duty at the age of 32.

Matt married his wife Elizabeth in 2020 and bought their first home in Dixon, California to start their family. They had two children: their first son was born in 2021, and their second in 2023. Matt could often be found at Play4All Park with his sons on his days off from work. Play4all Park held

a special place for Matt and Elizabeth as it was a place of inclusivity where all could enjoy and have fun.

Hispanic Heritage Month is an annual celebration of the history and culture of the U.S. Latino and Hispanic communities. Hispanic Heritage Month 2024 begins on **Sunday, September 15 and runs through Tuesday, October 15.**

This event commemorates how Latino and Hispanic communities have influenced and contributed to American society. The entertainment program will also include whip master, Francisco Pulido, from Rancho El Zapotillo in Dixon, and his horse Brownie. Pulido has been roping for over forty years and will be demonstrating his roping and riding skills for visitors.


Award winning vocalist Jimena Izquierido of Woodland will return for her third appearance at Peña Adobe to share her powerful voice with park visitors. Jimena has been celebrating her Hispanic Heritage and singing since she was 7 years old.

Churro My Heart, a Fairfield-based churro vendor will be offering sweet churros to park visitors from 11am-2pm. The Pena Adobe is one of the oldest structures in Solano County, dating back to 1842, when the Juan Felipe Pena and Manuel Vaca families settled in Vacaville. The park is also home to the Mowers-Goheen Museum, with its artifacts from the area's settlement, as well as the Willis Linn Jepson Memorial Garden and the Indian Council Ground. Volunteers, including two fifth generation Peña descendents will offer tours of the museum, the adobe and the grounds.

According to the Benicia Historical Museum, "Doña Benicia came from a long line of strong women. Her mother was one of the first woman winemakers in Sonoma County. At the age of 17, she traveled for four weeks by mule while pregnant to reach her husband, General Mariano Guadalupe Vallejo and was the mother of 16 children of which ten survived to adulthood. After the founding of Benicia, named after her, she began to go by that name instead of Francisca and was thereafter known as Doña Benicia."

Republic Services annual rate changes



In March 2022, the Fairfield City Council approved Resolution 2022-53, the solid waste franchise agreement between the city of Fairfield and Republic Services. The franchise agreement, among other things, stipulates service rates for waste collection services.

As a part of the agreed-upon terms, service rates may be adjusted on an annual basis. Per section

6.3 of the franchise agreement, Republic Services is requesting a 4.50% rate increase for collection services for Calendar Year 2025.

Rate adjustments are permitted based on changes in the Consumer Price Index (CPI.) Per the franchise agreement, if the CPI Republic Services Annual Rate Changes exceeds 4.50% for the previous 12-month average, the total rate adjustment for the following year will not exceed 4.50%. If CPI changes are lower 4.50%, the rate adjustment will be equal to the CPI value.

For the previous period (July 2023-June 2024), the CPI rose by 6.43%, as such, Republic Services is entitled to a 4.50% rate increase.

Rate adjustments take effect annually on January 1, 2025.

Solano County to open fish and wildlife propagation fund grant cycle for fiscal year 2024-2025

Solano County Parks, in coordination with Solano County Parks and Recreation Commission, is pleased to announce the official launch of the fiscal year 2024-2025 Fish and

Wildlife Propagation Fund grant cycle, beginning September 7, 2024.

The Solano County Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund, under the direction of the Solano County Board of Supervisors, uses funds from fish and wildlife related fines and forfeitures in Solano County for projects and

programs involved in the protection, conservation, propagation, and preservation of fish and wildlife.

The fiscal year 2024-2025 (FY2024/25) grant cycle is funded for up to \$10,000 with a maximum grant request up to \$2,500 with no match requirement necessary. Grant funding is available to units of government, including special districts organized under federal, state, or local laws, accredited educational institutions, and private non-profit with current 501(c)(3) status. The impact of these grant dollars can be large, with past funded projects including support for environmental education materials for classrooms, field trips, habitat restoration and protection, and wildlife protection and recovery work.

Previously only latex paint was accepted. Oil base items include:

- Interior and exterior architectural paints: acrylic, alkyd, oilbased, enamel (including textured coatings)
- Deck coatings, floor paints (including elastomeric)
- Primers, sealers, under-coaters
- Stains, shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, urethanes (single component)
- Waterproofing concrete/masonry/wood sealers and repellents (not tar or bitumen-based)
- Metal coatings, rust preventatives
- Field and lawn paints.

This facility will also continue to accept light tubes, CFLs, household batteries, car batteries (No EV), motor oil and oil filters, antifreeze, latex paint, and aerosols. No charge to Benicia residents.

Free compost giveaway for Fairfield residents

The city of Fairfield and Republic Services are holding a free compost giveaway event for Fairfield residents from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, September 14, at the Dunnell Nature Park and Education Center at 3351 Hillridge Drive in Fairfield.



No appointment is necessary, but proof of residency is required. Master Gardeners from the UCCE Solano will be onsite to provide residents with information about compost uses and other horticultural tips and tricks.

The compost will be delivered in bulk and residents should bring their own containers/bags to fill up and take home. Residents can take as much compost as they want while supplies last. This is a self-serve event, but shovels and gloves will be provided for use. Limit one trip per resident.

The compost is from Northern Compost (Yolo County) and is listed by the Organic Materials Review Institute (OMRI) for use in organic production, approved as an Organic Input Fertilizing Material by the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA), and is certified with the United States Composting Council's Seal of Testing Assurance. The compost is made from recycled green material, food waste, and woody material collected from residential organic carts.

Compost giveaway events are part of the city's sustainability and Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) goals. Volunteers are needed! If you would like to volunteer at the giveaway, please contact Karen Rees at (707) 428-7767.


