

Happy New Year to our Jewish residents!

Rosh Hashanah is one of Judaism's holiest days and begins at sunset on Wednesday.

The two-day celebration marks the start of the Jewish New Year and is filled with traditions, like eating a round challah and saying prayers near a body of water.

This year, the holiday will start at sunset on Oct. 2 and end at sundown on Oct. 4 The exact date of the holiday varies every year — last year it started on Sept. 15 — but is almost always in September or October.

Rosh Hashanah is the only Jewish holiday that is two days long, both inside and outside Israel. It's called "yoma arichta", translated as "a long day" because the 48-hour celebration may be thought of as one extended day.

Rosh Hashanah is often treated as a time to reflect on the previous year and focus on hopes for the coming year.

California Forever is currently redefining the description of the project once again, this time to follow the county's standard planning process, which must include an environmental impact report to meet the California Environmental Quality Act, or CEQA. Their goal is to again take their updated development plan to the voters of Solano County in 2026.

Typically, going through the CEQA process is a nightmare for developers and is a long process with having to adopt all feasible mitigation measures. Including impacts, concerns and challenges from state agencies, local agencies, environmental groups, and the general public, who are callously termed as "sensitive receptors".

California eliminates written driving test for most people 70 and older renewing their license

As of Oct. 1, those older drivers whose licenses expire as of 2024 won't need to take the written knowledge test. DMV officials noted that the requirement was a policy, not the law.


Partial shutdown of I-680 planned this weekend in East Bay: Here's what to know

Partial closures on a stretch of Interstate 680 in the East Bay are planned this weekend for an ongoing paving project, according to Caltrans.

The two left lanes of southbound I-680 will be closed between Alcosta Boulevard in San Ramon and the I-580/I-680 connector in Pleasanton from 9 p.m. Friday through 4 a.m. Monday, according to the agency's website.

State Route 220 (SR-220) J-Mack Ferry will be Dry Docked for Required Hull Inspection



Caltrans has scheduled a long-term closure of the State Route 220 J-Mack Ferry. The closure starts Sunday Night, September 29, and will continue for approximately 2-3 months.

The closure is needed to perform repairs and federally mandated Coast Guard inspections. Per Coast Guard regulations, the J-Mack ferry cannot operate until the boat is drydocked, the hull has been inspected at its 5-year interval, and the inspection is completed.

The Delta's companion ferry, the Real Mccoy Ferry (SR-84) can be used for crossings, while the J-Mack Ferry is out of service. However, due to ongoing mechanical repairs please be advised that both ferries could be out of service at any given time. Caltrans urges the public to plan all travels around the delta region to avoid any delays.

Drivers are encouraged to use Caltrans Quickmap for the latest highway conditions. http://quickmap.dot.ca.gov/ For the latest information, call the Caltrans Ferry Update Line at (510) 622-0120.

Please note that Caltrans has scheduled three upcoming 55-hour full weekend closures on the SR-12 Rio Vista Bridge. The closures are needed to perform needed repairs including roadway surface and bridge deck repairs, replacing bridge rails, installing bridge approach slabs and installing ADA compliant pedestrian ramps. Detours will be in effect.

Why lanes on the Bay Bridge are closing every weeknight for 8 months

Nighttime drivers on weeknights can expect congestion while crossing the oldest <u>bridge</u> into San Francisco until the spring.

Starting Thursday, Caltrans is <u>closing one to two far right lane</u> on the westbound side of the <u>San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge</u> from 8 p.m. to 4 a.m. on weeknights for routine inspection and maintenance of the cables, Caltrans spokesperson Lori Shepherd told SFGATE. The closure starts at the Yerba Buena Island Tunnel and ends at the downtown San Francisco side of the bridge.

Supervisors to receive update on Board priority areas



A Solano County press release:

On Tuesday, October 8, 2024, staff will host a facilitated Board Priority Workshop where Board members will receive an update on department workplans, and

progress made in priority areas established last year. The Board will also consider providing direction to staff in implementing Board priorities, with a focus on economic development and agriculture preservation and development.

Last year, on April 18, 2023, the Solano County Board of Supervisors hosted a Board priority setting session, giving Board members an opportunity to share and discuss their top priorities for the County. During the meeting, Board members identified several topic areas, which were grouped into five major categories, including (1) economic development, (2) agriculture preservation and development, (3) housing, (4) County workforce development and (5) County services – regulations and policies.





City of Vallejo releases RFP for operator of Homeless Navigation Center



The city of Vallejo has released a Request for Proposals (RFP) to identify a qualified operator for the new Vallejo Homeless Navigation Center. This facility will provide shelter and critical services to individuals and couples experiencing homelessness in the community, offering them support and resources that contribute to stability and self-sufficiency.

Vallejo is seeking an operator that prioritizes an equitable and inclusive approach, ensuring fair access to services and shelter for all participants. The operator must demonstrate a strong commitment to equity, working closely with the community to maintain a safe and welcoming environment for both participants and surrounding neighborhoods. This includes gathering feedback from those served and implementing data-driven strategies to continuously enhance service delivery, while fostering positive relationships with local residents to address concerns and ensure the Navigation Center is a beneficial resource for all.

The Vallejo Navigation Center will provide 125 shelter beds. In addition to shelter, the center will offer individual case management, access to social and medical services, and job training to help participants develop skills that support their journey to stability.

The selected operator will manage the center's daily operations and deliver wrap-around services, focusing on a Housing First philosophy that emphasizes harm reduction, trauma-informed care, and low-barrier entry to shelter.

Vallejo plans to execute a two-year Consultant and Professional Services Agreement with the selected provider, with the possibility

of contract extensions based on performance. Proposals can be submitted through the City's procurement system at https://pbsystem.planetbids.com/portal/42510/portal-home under the project title "Vallejo Homeless Navigation Center." The deadline for proposal submissions is October 18, 2024.

This initiative is made possible through funding and partnerships with the city of Vallejo, County of Solano, CAP Solano JPA, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, California Department of Housing and Community Development, Kaiser Permanente, Sutter Health, and NorthBay Health.

Addressing Benicia's pothole problem



Last week, three Benicia residents were invited to observe a pothole filling operation on Park Road. Filling potholes is not the preferred way to maintain a road, but due to limited funding it's

often the only option available for keeping a road functioning.

Filling potholes on a busy street like Park Road is not a simple task. The operation requires advanced planning, material procurement, equipment staging, safety meetings, and traffic control. Each pothole must be dug out, cleaned, coated, filled with cold mix asphalt, and compacted.


City crews fill 500 potholes and perform 75-100 more extensive patch-and-paves each year. It is just one of the ways the city keeps traffic flowing on Benicia's 200 lane-mile road network.



Native American Heritage Day at the Adobe



The Peña Adobe Historical Society will celebrate Native American Heritage on Saturday, October 5 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Meet author Richard Burrill who has published seven books on Ishi, the last surviving member of the California Native American Yahi

tribe. Ishi was discovered in 1911 in Oroville, CA and was taken to UC Berkeley where anthropologists studied him. Burrill's newest book "Unvanquished: Ishi's Story of Survival, Resilience, and Forgiveness" details those first four months of Ishi's life in San Francisco from Sept. 4, 1911, to Dec. 31, 1911.

The Cache Creek Conservancy was founded in 1996 with a mission to restore, preserve and protect the Cache Creek watershed. They operate from and manage the Jan T. Lowrey Cache Creek Nature Preserve in Woodland, CA. The <u>Tending and Gathering Garden (TGG)</u> is a collaborative effort between the Native American community and the Conservancy to demonstrate traditional land and plant management practices of California's native people. Situated on 3-acres in the Cache Creek Nature Preserve, the TGG is home to culturally significant native plants found within the Cache Creek watershed. Visit the Conservancy's booth and learn about the important work they do.

Drums are a universal instrument used by cultures all around the world. Since 2009, Richard Flittie's inspiration for making drums has come from his Mother's Native American traditions of the Oglala Lakota and Sioux. Richard's passion for drums has led him to make, and teach others to make, nearly 1,000 drums! Come see Richard's drums and enjoy the calming, healing and joy that comes from playing drums.

"Kalpulli" is the term that refers to group or family, the social organizing principle in cities throughout the Central American Aztec Empire. "Anahuak" is the name for water from the four sacred directions. The Kalpulli Anahuak Aztec Dancers, who recently danced at the 7 Generations Tribal Council Annual Summer Powwow at Solano College, will demonstrate Aztec dances for park visitors.

Come to the Peña Adobe and tour the former home of the Peña family and Museum. Make a corn husk doll! Make a shell necklace on a Native American pump drill! Learn about the Native Americans who lived here long before the Vacas and Peñas arrived in 1841.

Vallejo Waterfront Weekend Behind the Fences Bus Tour



Join in on a unique journey by bus to three rarely seen *Behind the Fences* locations on the historic Mare Island Naval Shipyard. Local Historian, Dennis Kelly and as well as Mare Island Historic Park Foundation (MIHPF) docents will be on hand to provide the fascinating histories and tales behind these historic spots as the community peers inside the Haunted Armory Building 77, *Old 84* Mare Island Prison, and the original Mare Island Stables (the second oldest building on the Island).






